

# Phil Beaver's "Sunflowers, Poinsettias and Much More"

## Materials List

### **Students in quilting workshop supply:**

- General sewing gear, including but not limited to scissors, thread, pins
- Sewing machine with darning/embroidery foot (machine is optional for two/three day classes, but necessary for longer workshops)
- Pen/pencil, notepaper
- Water spritz bottle
- Background fabric, not to exceed 72", for sunflower and/or poinsettia designs, 3 or 4 choices are best, (see MANY quilt pieces done by quilters in earlier workshops, [www.philbeaver.com](http://www.philbeaver.com), click Travelogue)
- Batting, not to exceed 72"
- Fabric for backside of finished work, not to exceed 72"

The first day of each workshop is always spent painting fabrics. The paint is very permanent and a bit messy -- wear old clothes on day one. Also, on the first day bring a water spritz bottle, pen/pencil and note paper, and scissors for fabric and paper. A desk stapler is useful but optional. On day one, do not bring machines -- they won't be used while painting and we often don't have room to store them until this part of workshop is complete.

### **Phil Beaver provides: (\$48.00 materials fee for each student)**

- 2 yards PFD superior, white cotton fabric for painting
- Fabric paints for beautiful watercolor wash effects
- Wooden stretcher strips for stretching fabrics (the use of)
- Rock salt
- Brushes
- Palettes
- Styrofoam for elevating fabrics for drying
- Water cups
- Tacks
- Poster boards
- Fabric glue (Roxanne)
- Freezer paper
- Paper patterns for sunflowers and poinsettias (from the J. Phil Beaver collection)
- Fusible web for fabrics
- Paper towels

Also available in the classroom and not included on the Materials List shall be numerous other paper patterns from the J. Phil Beaver collections, such as several hen and rooster chickens, great blue herons, Canada geese, barns, children's toys, pumpkins, small birds, maple and oak leaves and acorns, irises, daffodils, tulips, rabbits, mallard ducks, and many, many more.
