

Machine Appliqué

The First Day:

This class will teach you how to use my Appliqué foundation paper to create the lovely look of hand appliqué, all the appliqué is done by machine.

This class is designed for the average quilter that wants to move onto a higher level of work. Every quilter will love this class.

If you have loved applique but were afraid to try, with this technique you can do the most beautiful appliqué ever.

Supplies & Equipment needed:

Sewing machine, that does a very small zigzag. Stipple foot, single needle plate,

Quarter inch piecing foot. Extension table for machine (a must).

Size 75 machine embroidery needles.

Mettler size 50/3 cotton thread to match your back ground

Sulky poly monofilament thread (smoke and clear)

Basic sewing Kit.

Freezer paper.

Elmer's School Glue

Permanent fabric glue (Liquid Stitch by Prim Dritz)

Cuticle stick, (found in the manicure department)

4 Elmer's Washable school glue sticks

Permanent marking pen.

Scissors (Paper and fabric scissors).

Spray Starch

1/2" Stencil Brush

2 wash rags to keep your hands clean

Hard pressing Mat.

Iron: You will need your own.

The only one that I find is hot enough to work is a Rowenta travel iron. You will need to purchase one. This is a must, no other iron works.

The Second and Third Day: (Machine Quilting)

This part of the class explores the quilting process. We will go over marking techniques.

How to enhance the quilt top with quilting and how to include beautiful stipple work with feathers.

Supplies needed:

2-22" Squares of muslin (for practice).

2 25" squares of squares of batting. I like Hobb's wool bat.

50 Weight Aurifil Cotton

Your favorite marking tool

Tweezers, thimble,

DMC hand embroidery thread for basting, Quilt basting needles.

Quilting gloves or Quilt Halo

Fabrics:

Assorted fabrics:

1 yard of light fabric for back ground

4-10" squares of purples/pinks for blooms

3-10" squares of greens for stems and leaves
